

Tribal Coalitions Program



- Currently 20 OVW designated Tribal Coalitions within 17 states.
- Organizations may propose to incorporate and operate a tribal coalition in areas where Indian tribes are located but no tribal coalition exists.
- The ways that tribal coalitions serve their regions is constantly growing and developing.



Grants to Indian Tribal Governments Program

Tribal governmental responses to increase victim safety and ensure offender accountability




Tribal Sexual Assault Services Program (TSASP)

- Over 40 tribes and tribal organizations currently funded
- Programs provide <u>direct services</u> to sexual assault survivors and their families in Indian Country and Alaska Native villages
- Funded by a statutory set-aside from OVW's Sexual Assault Services Program

Prohibited Activities

- Prevention and Public Education
- Criminal Justice-related Law Enforcement, Prosecution, Courts, Forensic Interviewing, etc.
- Providing DV victim services unrelated to Sexual Assault
- SA Forensic Medical Examiner
- SART Coordination
- Providing training to allied professionals (law enforcement, courts, CPS, etc.)





Tribal Jurisdiction Program - Special Tribal Criminal Jurisdiction



- Monetary and technical support across the planning, implementation, and exercising phases of criminal jurisdiction
- Over 35 Tribes are currently funded
 19 are exercising the jurisdiction
- Two tribes in Alaska are currently funded
- ANJC was funded as the Alaska based T/TA Provider to work with Tribes on STCJ

Tribal Special Assistant United States Attorney (Tribal SAUSA)

- ✔ First piloted in FY12
- ✓ FY22 received appropriated line item

Goals

- 1. Fill gaps in jurisdictional coverage;
- 2. Increase communication between federal prosecutors and the Tribal community; and
- 3. Improve the quality of IC sexual assault, domestic violence, dating violence, stalking, and sex trafficking cases being brought for prosecution.
- Requires strong commitment from both the USAO and the Tribe.




Tribal Special Assistant United States Attorney (Tribal SAUSA)

Be consistent throughout the entire application package.

Tips for Writing Your Proposal

- Don't underestimate the "easy" stuff.
- Avoid using acronyms and do not assume the reviewer knows.
- Use recent and relevant local data-tell your community's story— cite your sources.
- ✓ Address ALL sections and questions.
- Use the headers, section titles provided; include page numbers and follow formatting guidance.
- TIP Turn on "Track Changes" then pass it to a couple other folks for fresh eyes and comments.



Tips for Applying – Just a Few more....

- Checklists Templates Samples
- Be in compliance and good standing with current and past awards.
- Ensure contact information is current, especially email addresses.
- Use clear file names for electronic documents. Print and keep copies of all online grant application.
- ✓ Submit the application by the due dates!!! There are two Due Dates.
- ✓ DO NOT WAIT until the due date to begin submission.


